

This has been a year of success and growth for Cookeville Regional Charitable Foundation. I am so grateful to our donors and community partners for supporting compassionate, charitable programs for our friends and neighbors struggling with disease, sickness and injury. Within the past year we have expanded programs to include Care Carts, the Angel Garden, Music Therapy, and a durable medical equipment program called Project ProCure. New community partnerships have developed which enable us to better impact community healthcare services, including partnerships with the Upper Cumberland Healthcare Coalition, Tennessee Tech University, and nearly a dozen local non-profit organizations.



Thanks to generous donations from caring community members, the Foundation was able to provide direct aid to 1,446 patients last year and indirect assistance to thousands of other residents in our Upper Cumberland community. Together with donors, volunteers and partners, we are providing hope and healing to thousands in our community who need a helping hand, during some of the most difficult moments of their lives. Recipients of assistance represent fourteen Tennessee counties, come from all walks of life, and range in age from infants to nearly 100 years old.

The Cookeville Regional Charitable Foundation is leading the effort to compassionately respond to the charitable healthcare needs of our community.

PATIENTS

- 1,446 patients received support in 2015.
- 35% of aid recipients are Cancer patients.
- 6% of aid recipients are Hospice patients.
- 11% of aid recipients are Heart patients.
- 100% of recipients are vetted by case managers and healthcare providers.

ASSISTANCE COMES IN MANY FORMS

- 9% enabling access to healthcare for rural patients
- 6% proper food and nutrition
- 19% housing, utilities, home-based needs
- 6% medicine and medical equipment
- 48% medical procedures, screenings and follow-up care
- 11% continuation of insurance coverage
- 1% other

FUNDS

- **Unrestricted:** may be used for charitable programs, community services, patient assistance, education, Foundation operation.
- **Caring Hands:** may be used to assist any indigent patient
- **Restricted Funds:** Cancer, Diabetes, Heart, Hospice, Mental Health, Pediatric

PROGRAMS

- **Angel Garden:** A place to remember, honor and grieve children who pass away early in life
- **Art for Healing:** Promoting creative art activities for patients, and installing fine art at CRMC
- **Care Carts:** Carts filled with patient and family care items. (for special cases and palliative care)
- **Community Health:** Healthcare education and free or discounted healthcare services
- **Dailey & Vincent:** Education & Assistance fund for children of DeKalb and Jackson Counties
- **Giving Big:** Support for local non-profits offering compassionate programs
- **Healing Gardens:** Beautifying the CRMC campus with memorial and honorarium gardens
- **Music Therapy:** Offering live and recorded music performances at CRMC & in patient rooms
- **Pink Ribbon of Hope:** Free mammogram screenings and breast health awareness
- **Pet Therapy:** Therapy dog visits for cancer patients and to area schools and libraries
- **Project ProCure:** Donated medical equipment for use by in-need patients for free


