I am so grateful for the support the Foundation received this year from caring donors and volunteers. Together, we were able to respond with compassion to requests for help from 1,804 patients living in all corners of the Upper Cumberland. Patients were referred by case managers and social workers at CRMC, physician offices, hospice providers, health departments and non-profit organizations. It is refreshing to see so many organizations working together for the benefit of residents struggling with disease, sickness or injury.



Many families rely on the Foundation during the days and weeks after a medical emergency. Often during an emergency, patients are unable to work for some time and families struggle to pay for home needs like utilities and groceries. Donors to the Foundation help keep food on the table and lights on for hundreds of families who already have a heavy burden dealing with a health emergency.

Other patients find themselves unable to afford needed medication or medical equipment. Often, these are critical to recovery and maintaining good health but may not be covered by insurance. Even seemingly inexpensive medications that cost under \$25/month are problematic for many patients. These situations are especially common for patients on a fixed income.

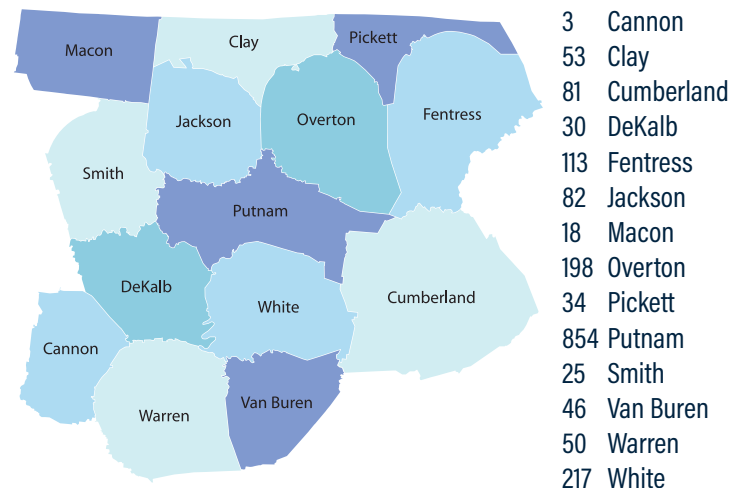
