Compassionate Care For The Upper Cumberland

The CRMC Foundation is a non-profit organization responding to growing health disparities in our community. We collect donations and use them to help local residents of the Upper Cumberland through a wide range of charitable programs and assistance funds established by our supporters.

Assistance Funds: Working with providers in 14 counties to compassionately care for Upper Cumberland residents with charitable healthcare needs. Our focus is to provide services for struggling local residents and their families, focusing on working-poor and at-risk demographics.

Programs: Engaging with regional, collaborative initiatives addressing health and wellness needs in our community. Some programs focus on services within the hospital setting, while others address broader community activities.

Operating and staff expenses at the Foundation are covered through sponsorship from Cookeville Regional Medical Center. This allows 100% of gifts to go toward programs and direct support.

Together, with donors and partners, we are building a healthier and more compassionate Upper Cumberland community.



Moms cancer has been tough to fight. I'm working and trying to help her. She has been too sick to do a lot.


The help with transportation has been great. That way I don't have to take off work to bring her to treatment.




